THE HISTORY OF THE CLUB

Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport. The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio” - for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against us then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club’s existence we were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as our opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Mr Tony Sitford, we progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made us unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s we dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century we reviewed the whole structure of our football club and decided that we had lost our roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on our senior side. So, we decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst we rebuilt the lower levels of the club. In 2008 we had managed to create a club running 5 sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that we needed to consider the next step in our restructuring. For two seasons we had a liaison with Welling United, integrating a senior side within Welling United and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end.

When the opportunity came for us to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club, we did not hesitate to take it. Probably 2 years too soon, but the challenge was one we were keen to take. We introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help us progress our u18’s into men’s football.

The 2010 / 11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division plus three youth sides – u14, u15 and u18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an u18 side in the Ryman Youth League. We feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling us to offer a true progression for all our players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16, 17/18 ,18/19 and 19/20 seasons saw the addition of u13 and u15 team playing in the Kent Youth League.

After untimely ends to the 2019/20 & 2020/21 seasons, when the boys were flying high, we are delighted to have retained the main squad, with the addition of some of last season u18’s.

Corinthian Football Club are delighted to have been promoted into the Isthmian League Division 1 South East for the 2021/22 season and are looking forward to the challenge, to visiting new grounds and making new friends.

For our 21/22 campaign we continue with sides in the Suburban League Premier Division, Isthmian u18 East Division as well as the Isthmian South East Division.

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

I am delighted to welcome Grays Athletic FC players, officials, supporters, and today's match officials to Gay Dawn Farm for what should be an excellent afternoon of football – in the First Round Qualifying of the Buildbase FA Trophy. This is a historic day, as this is Corinthian FC's first ever appearance in the FA Trophy.

The Football Association Challenge Trophy, commonly known as the FA Trophy, is a men's football knockout cup competition run by and named after the English Football Association and competed for primarily by semi-professional teams. The competition was instigated in 1969 to cater for those non-league clubs that paid their players and were therefore not eligible to enter the FA Amateur Cup

Eligibility rules have changed over time, but from 2008 onwards the competition has been open to clubs playing in Steps 1–4 of the National League System, equivalent to tiers 5–8 of the overall English football league system. This covers the National League, the Southern League, Isthmian League, and Northern Premier League.

The final of the competition was held at the original Wembley Stadium from the tournament's instigation until the stadium closed in 2000. The final has been played at the new Wembley Stadium since its opening in 2007. The record for the most FA Trophy wins is shared by Woking and two defunct clubs, Scarborough and Telford United, with three victories each.

The Trophy is currently held by Hornchurch who beat Hereford in the 2020-21 final held on 22 May 2021.

There will be a total of 310 clubs in the Buildbase FA Trophy and 618 clubs in the Buildbase FA Vase for the 2021-22 campaign.

Should there be a draw today, the replay will be held on Wednesday 29th September, 19.45pm ko at Aveley FC, Parkside, Park Le, South Ock, RM15 4PX

Enjoy, the match, enjoy the rest of the season, and have a safe journey home.

Yet again, we have a cup fixture this season, against a team that is top of their division - I am not sure what we have done to upset the FA fixtures secretary!! So despite home advantage, we know there is no pressure on us and we can go out and play with a freedom and hopefully the players will express themselves and put on a good performance.

Saturday saw us fall to yet another close fought by ultimately disappointing defeat at Herne Bay. The positives are that we have yet again competed and perhaps shaded a match, particular the second half against a team that are predicted to be challenging at the top of our league. We also saw full debuts for both Charlie Edmundson and Brandon Davey, which I would like to congratulate both on this achievement.

After today, we then go on a run of games playing against teams that aren't necessarily predicted to be some of the top teams and games that we need to realistically start picking up points to move ourselves up the league table. Today is a great distraction from league football and we know only too well how good the FA competitions are and how good they can be for momentum and raising performance levels.

Performance levels have generally been good and I am sure it is only a matter of time before results follow suit - Your support as always is very much appreciated by myself and the players - Now more than ever before!

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

THE WARNING from the Kent FA on the fall in numbers of match officials for grassroots fixtures makes for worrying reading. Put simply, without referees, the football system cannot function properly.

In an open letter to clubs, the county FA's referee development officer Nick Dunn explained the issues they, and many other county associations, seem to be facing in grassroots football.

He said: "We closed the 2020-2021 season with over 1,634 match officials affiliated; the most we have ever received. Ensuring transparency, at this present time of the 2021-2022 season we have 1,247 affiliated match officials, representing almost a 24 per cent loss.

"To put this loss into footballing terms, if each of those 400 referees lost were to referee approximately 20 games a season it results in approximately 8,000 matches being played without a referee."

Dunn says the matches under their control without a referee are at an all-time high. Not only does this not help the grassroots game, but it makes the development of referees and the progression through the system tougher.

At The NLP, we've experienced first-hand the good work the FA are putting in to encourage the development of referees, and therefore retain them. But it's always going to be hard to keep filling the tank when they are subjected to some of the abuse we see all too often.

Dunn points out that the conduct and behaviour of a minority of participants is not the sole reason for the drop-off, but he believes it is a fundamental one.

Where are we as a society and sport if a match official can't turn up on a Saturday afternoon or a Sunday morning without fear of what might happen should they dare make a decision somebody doesn't agree with?

Remember, it might not just come from a player. But spectators or parents overstepping the mark, managers and coaches failing to conduct themselves as they should.

Football is a passionate game. Nobody wants to take that out of it. But there is a very clear line that shouldn't be crossed. And passion isn't a good enough reason for losing control over a game of football - something everyone is supposed to be involved in because they enjoy it. Verbal threats, physical attacks, abusive comments on social media after the game – yes, it's a minority but it's far too much.

Often culprits will be handed fines and suspensions. The authorities can only do what they can do, individuals have to take responsibility.

But the game as a whole must also pull together to stamp it out. Clubs must hand out their own individual punishments to the people associated to them who go too far.

Often, this concerns adults going over board at kids football. That's even more worrying when a parent can't control their reactions. We'd like to think they would realise the impact it has on their own child's enjoyment.

The majority of people get involved as a match official because they enjoy the game too. No wonder some are choosing to walk away. Let's put on a united front to keep them safe – and in the game.

GRAYS ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB HISTORY



The roots of the modern day Grays Athletic can be traced back as far as 1888, although 1890 has become the de facto established formation date. The reasons for this disparity are almost certainly lost in the mists of time. Grays Athletic therefore celebrated its centenary in 1990, played at The Recreation Ground, Bridge Road from 1906 to 2010, and became members of the Athenian League in 1912.

Grays became very strong after the Second World War, winning the Essex Senior Cup in 1945 and winning the Corinthian League and Cup in 1946. They rejoined the Athenian League in 1958 where they remained until 1983. In 1981 the Club Patron Mr Ron Billings purchased the ground and the Club was reformed as a Limited Company in 1982 under the guidance of Jeff and Fred Saxton. In 1983 a fire destroyed the 400-seater stand that included the dressing and kit rooms. Ron Billings came to the rescue by building the Ball Court Complex that included dressing rooms, club room and bar. Grays went on to become Isthmian Division 2 Champions in 1985.

The Club's principal objective remains to develop a new community football facility in conjunction with the new Orsett Heath Academy and Treetops Special Needs School in the North Grays area of Thurrock. Long delays have been caused by the proposals for a new Lower Thames Crossing which would cut across huge swathes of land in the borough, including many acres of land which could provide for the facility we crave and the incidence of the coronavirus which has curtailed the progress of Thurrock Council's new Local Plan, which we hope will make provision for an educational and sporting centre of excellence in North Grays. The elected club board still have every intention of working with Thurrock Council, Orsett Heath Academy, Treetops School, the Football Association and developers to "Bring Grays Athletic back to Grays".

In the meantime, we continue to groundshare with Aveley FC at their superbly appointed Parkside Stadium.
